

TERMS OF USE

The Second Administrative Level Boundaries programme of the United Nations aims to make available an interoperable, accessible, and global repository of authoritative information, tables and geospatial data, about the administrative units and names of countries down to the second subnational level, including through time (hereinafter the “**SALB Data**”) from information contributed by the relevant authorities of Member States of the United Nations (hereinafter the “**Contributors**”). The SALB Data is provided free of charge to national governments, international organizations, international civil society organizations, as well as statisticians, geospatial experts and researchers, and the general public (hereinafter the “**Users**”).

The SALB Data is provided “as is,” without warranty of any kind, either express or implied, including, without limitation, warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose and non-infringement. Links to external sites are provided for informational purposes only, and do not imply the endorsement by the United Nations.

The designations employed and the presentation of material on the maps, tables, documents and geospatial data prepared in the context of the SALB programme do not imply the expression of any opinion whatsoever on the part of the Secretariat of the United Nations concerning the legal status of any country, territory, city or area or of its authorities, or concerning the delimitation of its frontiers or boundaries. The term “country” as used in the context of the SALB programme also refers, as appropriate, to territories or areas.

Users acknowledge that their right to access and use the SALB Data is revocable and non-transferable.

If Users wish to use SALB as a basis for derived products, they may do so in adding attributes and aggregating original SALB data for their purpose but are required to credit the source and include the phrase “from SALB Data, United Nations” and name of respective Contributors’ source as in the metadata.

The SALB Data may be used for only non-commercial purposes.

The United Nations reserves the right to deny any User access to the SALB Data or any portion thereof without notice at its sole discretion.

Nothing herein shall a waiver, express or implied, of any of the privileges and immunities of the United Nations, which are specifically reserved.
